Covenant of Grace and the Ten Commandments

How would you tell your story? Would you begin with where you were born or where you lived? "I was born in Elkin, North Carolina, I moved to Salisbury when I was three years old." Would you include major events that impacted in your life? "My first cross country race I ran, was the state championship for 13 year old's, in which I won. I was married to Melanie Kilby in Sanford, North Carolina. We had a son Aidan, born in Pasquotank County, North Carolina and a son Own, born in Roanoke County, Virginia." Would your story include any aspects of your faith? "I became a Christian at the age of 12 and was baptized at First Baptist Church, Salisbury, NC. I felt called to ministry at an FCA camp in Brevard, NC during a college retreat. During this year dealing with difficult family situations, God has sustained me."

For some of us in telling our story, we would share about our family, our work, or our schools. We may include stories about our passions or hobbies. Hopefully, our stories would include our faith, our acknowledgement of God. For the Hebrew people, their faith was remembered and shared through stories. The story they would share first would be the story of the exodus. When they were enslaved and oppressed by the Egyptians, they cried out to God. God heard their cries and delivered them to freedom. The exodus story reminds the Hebrew people that God knows their situation and hears their prayers. The Hebrew stories remind them of a God who cares and a God who is near. The ten commandments, by extension, are a part of the exodus story, God's response to their prayers. The commandments were meant to give them a guide to live by, rules to follow. Just as a parent sets rules for the children to follow because it is what is best for them to grow, learn, and succeed, these commandments are given by God to His children out of love and grace. Our Christian faith is not based on a religion of law, where one strives to follow laws in order to be in relationship with God. This would be a religion based on works, what we as humans can do to reach God. Our faith is based on a religion of grace, where God extends His love to us, and out of love we follow His commands, trusting God knows what is best for our lives.

The ten commandments are ten truths to help us in our relationship with God and others. The first four are known as the vertical commandments, that focus on our relationship with God:

1. You shall have no other gods before me. ("Let God be God")
2. You shall not make for yourself an idol in the form of anything. ("No Idols")
3. You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God. ("No OMG")
4. Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. ("Remembering God")

The last six are known as the horizontal commandments, that focus on our relationship with others:

5. Honor your father and your mother. ("Loving Others: Honor Mom and Pop")
6. You shall not murder. ("Respect Others: No Murder")
7. You shall not commit adultery. ("Respect Others: No Adultery")
8. You shall not steal. ("Respect Others: No Stealing")
9. You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor. ("Be Kind, Be Gracious, Be Relational: No lying/No gossip")
10. You shall not covet. ("Be Kind, Be Gracious, Be Relational: No coveting")

In telling our life stories may we include these ten commands, these truths, as a way to honor God and live out the best story possible.

Financial Update -- Several months ago during our Bible Study time, we discussed the Philippian's church support of Paul in his mission work. Paul wrote to them expressing his appreciation and gratitude for their support when no other church helped. In all his words to them, he never said thank you. Those two words were not adequate to communicate his gratitude. Instead, Paul rejoiced greatly, and praised God for

their help. The only way Paul knew to say thank you was through his praise of God. We praise God for your support and gifts to Zion. We have had many good weeks of offering totals during the past several months. Each Sunday our budget goal is about \$7,500, and our average weekly gifts have been \$5,500-\$6,000. Currently, we are about \$11,000 behind budget and \$14,600 behind in meeting our expenses. As always, staff and church leaders are working to keep expenses low and working to be good stewards of our church resources. School is soon to be out, which means summer vacation will begin. It will be time to gas up the car, (if we can find a few extra nickels to afford the prices), pack our bags, and go. We go to spend time with family, to vacation, to travel. We go to work, to rest, and to have fun. As we go, keep in mind summer presents numerous opportunities to serve God, each of us using our gifts and talents. May we prayerfully consider ways we can help others, give back, and reach out to those in need over these next few summer months.

As you go: here are a few of the ways we can serve:

Zion Youth and Children Summer Chaperones and Leaders- There are numerous Youth and Children activities, camps, and mission trips planned for this summer, contact Carson, Carol, or Matt if you are interested in joining the fun.

Math Academy- Palmer Grove Baptist is hosting a Math Academy site for the northern part of Cleveland County July 8th-26th. Zion Baptist has partnered with Palmer Grove to help provide the valuable resource to the children of our community. Folks can help financially or by volunteering to be a driver. Zion will provide our van for the week of July 15th-19th. The van driver would pick up students from around 7am-8am and then return them home at 1pm each day. This could be one volunteer driver or have a few folks drive part of the week. Folks can volunteer to help serve the breakfast and lunch each day, or a few days during the program. The Math Academy also asks for folks to come and engage with the students as they get off the vans and as they are eating breakfast. They also need volunteers to help in the classroom each morning. Math Academy has certified teachers for staff, but welcomes and encourages any and all volunteers. For any high school or college student who would like to have some volunteer credits, Math Academy has a Student Fellows program where they would help each week of the program. July School Supplies Donations- During the month of July we will be collecting school supplies and backpacks to be given to Cecilia Beck and local schools to be distributed as they see the need. Some suggested items to donate are as follows: backpacks, 1" 3-ring binders, 2" 3-ring binders, wide-ruled notebook paper, solid color plastic folders, 5-tab dividers, yellow #2 pencils, erasers, glue sticks, 16-count crayons, pencil box or pouches, 3x5 index cards, wireless wide-ruled composition books and college-ruled composition books, spiral notebooks, pocket folders with prongs. At one point, Elizabethtown had received the most rain of any area, over 35 inches. Many needs still exist and it will take years for these areas to recover.
