Figs for breakfast, Kairos, and Pistos.

Mark in his gospel tells us a story of Jesus one morning heading into Jerusalem with His disciples, and He was hungry. We don't know if Jesus slept in and the disciples ate all the eggs and grits, or if He ate breakfast but just needed one more bite to eat before a busy day in Jerusalem. There in the distance, Jesus sees a fig tree. I like to imagine Jesus running over to the tree, (excited with the possibility of a delicious fig awaiting), but when he arrives there are no figs on the tree. He then says to the tree, "May no one ever eat fruit from you again." It may just be my sense of humor, but I find this story funny. Jesus is hungry, sees a fig tree, goes to get a fig, in finding no figs on the tree, he curses the tree. How many of us have blamed our refrigerators for not having any milk, eggs, bacon, or worse no liver mush when we were hungry for breakfast? Mark adds his explanation for Jesus finding an empty tree, 'because it was not the season for figs.' (Mark 11:13). He uses the Greek work, *kairos*, for season. In fact, he uses this word several times throughout his gospel to communicate 'time', 'age', and 'season.' *Kairos* is more than our chronological view of time where we count the minutes, hours, and days. *Kairos* communicates a significant period, an important time for all to take note.

An interesting part of the fig tree story is right in the middle of it, Mark tells us the story of Jesus going to Jerusalem to clear out the temple. It looking at the fig and temple story together, we are able to see the symbolism of both. Jesus arrives at the temple and immediately begins driving out the people who were buying and selling offering items. He turns over the tables of the moneychangers and knocks over the benches of the sellers of doves. Jesus in teaching them quotes Isaiah and Jeremiah, "My house will be called a house of prayer for all nations, but you have made it a den of robbers." Jesus was upset with the people who were making a profit in God's name, using religion to increase their bank account. He was upset with the priests, scribes, and religious authority for allowing the corruption to happen. Jesus was upset with certain people who came to the temple with empty hearts for worship of God who refused to repent of their wrong ways.

The next morning the disciples saw the fig tree was withered from the roots, all dried up. The tree was cursed, no longer to bear fruit, even though it was not the season, *kairos*, for figs. From the disciple's perspective, it was unexpected for Jesus to look for figs on a fig tree out of season. From many people's perspective, it was unexpected for Jesus to show up at the temple and run folks out. If anything, they expected Jesus to arrive in Jerusalem, come to the temple and declare his kingship over the land. They expected Jesus to overthrow the Roman government, and establish his earthly rule. Just as it was not the season, *kairos*, for figs, it was not the season, *kairos*, for Jesus to rule in such a way as the

people expected. The cursed fig tree that was withered at the roots was symbolic of the temple to soon be withered at its roots. In Mark 13:1-2 as the disciples and Jesus were leaving the temple, they say to Him "look teacher, what massive stones, what magnificent buildings! Jesus replied, 'do you see all the great buildings, not one stone will be left on another; everyone will be thrown down." The *Kairos* was coming when Jesus would take his throne in God's kingdom through the cross, and people would not be limited to only worshiping God through the temple, but they would know and worship God through their relationship with Jesus.

These stories remind us that sometimes our expectations for life, how life should happen, or how fast or slow life passes, is not our *kairos*, but God's *Kairos*. Life can be difficult, dealing with death of loved ones, crisis with our health, and other unexpected problems. This reminds us that somethings are out of our control. We need to trust in God's *Kairos*. When the disciples noticed the fig tree Jesus had cursed was now withered and dried up, Jesus simply told them," Have faith in God." The Greek word for faith is *pistos*. Jesus wants us to have the type of faith, *pistos*, where we trust and believe God has the power to move mountains. Jesus encourages the disciples to pray as a way of exercising their faith. He adds, "as you stand praying, forgive." If you find yourself struggling to trust in God's *Kairos*, may we have the kind of faith, *pistos*, where we believe God has the power to move mountains. The *pistos* that reminds us of God's love for us so much that He sent His son to die on the cross for our mistakes. May we have the *pistos* to forgive others and ourselves. May we exercise our faith through prayer.


ZBC Fall Sermon Series
