

Join us for our Wednesday Evening Prayer Time and Bible Study of the book of Job, online at 6pm via our Facebook page or church website directly following. Tony and Jan Cartledge, the writers of the study guide, "Job—Into the Fire, Out of the Ashes,' share the following about the book of Job: "You have heard of the patience of Job,' said one New Testament writer (James 5:11). But have you heard of his *impatience*? Readers will

soon learn that Job's patience lasted barely a week. Shortly after suffering unspeakable tragedies, Job spoke surprisingly impassive words of acceptance and trust in God in the face of loss. After seven days of suffering in silence, however, Job filled the air with complaints and accusations toward the God who had repaid his righteousness with ravaging. All people who live long enough will experience suffering and unexpected sorrows that lead them to join Job in questioning whether God is playing fair. Questions come easily; answers are hard. Studying the story of Job requires us to enter a dark world that is sometimes painfully like our own. Sometimes, like Job, the lesson we learn may be that there are no clear answers or that we may be asking the wrong questions. The book of Job recounts a dark and dangerous journey toward unseen insights that challenge both human assumptions and traditional theological beliefs. Those who dare to enter Job's world may discover that their own world--or view of the world--has changed in surprising ways. In the end, however, those who stick with the ancient sufferer may discover spiritual depths that had not previously imagined."



It is hard to imagine we will soon begin the season of Lent, and in 40 short days (not including Sundays), we will be celebrating Easter. Never did I imagine we would still be dealing with the virus, wearing masks, social distancing, and not be able to gather as a church family as we have in the past. Yet here we are, we have made it this far, and we will continue forward.

The past year we have been looking at God's Unfolding Story each Sunday. We heard stories of creation and crisis, calling and captivity. We looked at the many adventure stories of Jesus. As we begin the season to prepare for the Easter Celebration, we will start a new series—Joining Jesus' Adventure. If you have ever run a race, then you most likely have experienced all the emotions of the starting line. Anticipation and excitement of the race. Anxious nerves and worry if your training has prepared you for this moment. As the race begins, those nerves turn to energy as you set off to do your best. Too often, many view their faith as a finish line, thinking, "I have made it, I believe in Jesus, life is good, nothing more to do." However, when we Join Jesus' Adventure, it is actually a starting line. We partner with Jesus to go about God's mission as we run the race of life. Yes, there may be hills and hard moments, but we are not running alone. We invite you to join us each Sunday during the season of Lent where each week we will look at Jesus' most concentrated teaching, in the Sermon on the Mount, (Matthew 5-7).

Ash Wednesday Contemplative Service-FLC 2/17

Join in a self guided, socially distanced, and safe Ash Wednesday Contemplative Service of Stations. Folks will pick up an individual bag of prepackaged items to be used at some of the nine stations located in the FLC. You will simply enter the FLC by the elevator entrance, and proceed to any station of your choosing. If someone is already at one of the stations simply choose another station or wait quietly for them to finish. There is no particular order to take for each station, except for Ashes, let this be your last station. Folks will then exit by the Small Dining Room side of the FLC. Stations: Clay, Water, Offering, Bell, Oil, Salt and Light, Forgiveness, Meditation, and Ashes.

As of January 31st, the 2021 giving is \$2,999.00 above expenses and is \$9,759.00 behind the budget. The weekly 2021 budget is \$7,055.04
