

#### **Observations from the Desert**

Have you ever been to the desert? I have never been; maybe seeing too many movies scenes about folks stranded in the desert having to struggle to survive has slowed my plans to visit. However, there are some pictures I have seen that make it appear to be a beautiful place. Maybe one day I will take a trip to the desert.

Jesus traveled into the desert immediately following his baptism and those powerful affirming words "You are My Son, whom I love, with you I am well pleased." Jesus, God's beloved Son, was sent out into the wilderness by the same Spirit that was present at His baptism. According to Mark's gospel, He was there in the wilderness for 40 days, during which He was tempted by Satan, with the wild animals, and attended to by angels. Matthew and Luke give us more details about Jesus time in the wilderness where he fasted for those forty days and resisted the Devil's temptations by saying no to the bread, no to the kingdoms, and no to the angelic body guards. Jesus passed the wilderness test. While none of us will ever face the same temptations Jesus faced, or even find ourselves fasting in the desert for forty days, we will spend some time in the wilderness. Wilderness times are when we are tested to our limits. We describe these times in life with words



such as dry, desolate, lonely, trying, difficult, agonizing. In those times we feel spiritual hunger and thirst. The wilderness can be a dangerous spiritual place. As much as we try, we cannot avoid the wilderness moments in life. But that can be a good thing, because sometimes in the wilderness we find the clarity we need, we gain grit and remember hope, we are strengthened spiritually, and we pass our wilderness tests.

I first met Wanda Kidd through her ministry partnership with Together for Hope, a rural poverty initiative. She had offered to share some of the proceeds from her handmade jewelry sales to a Together for Hope mission in Arkansas. The missionaries, instead of accepting the donations, asked if she would come and teach them and their youth how to make the jewelry. This led to the creation of a business for this ministry to help provide valuable resources to their community. I modeled this business as mission ministry at a rural mountain church in Virginia, but lacked any skills or knowledge of handmade jewelry. I called Wanda, and she was gracious to offer training, supplies, and the help we needed to get our new ministry started.

During the Season of Lent last year, Wanda was on a sabbatical journey where she travelled out west through the desert. She has shared her observations of this trip in the form of 26 devotions to read during the Season of Lent. A different devotion for each day will be posted during the month of March, up until the 26th. May we all take some time during this season of Lent to spend some time in prayer and reflection as we journey to the cross and the Easter celebration.


#### **Monthly Mission Projects for March**

Some businesses closed, limited people are allowed in churches, and for many children there is remote school. Efrain Juarez, missionary and pastor in Huehuetenango, has asked for folks to help provide tablets for the children to use during their remote school lessons. Each tablet costs around \$100. Join us for our Wednesday Evening Prayer Time and Bible Study of the book of Job, online at 6pm via our Facebook page or church website directly following. Tony and Jan Cartledge, the writers of the study guide, "Job—Into the Fire, Out of the Ashes," share the following about the book of Job: "You have heard of the patience of Job," said one New Testament writer (James 5:11). But have you heard of his *impatience*? Readers will soon learn that Job's patience lasted barely a week. Shortly after suffering unspeakable tragedies, Job spoke surprisingly impassive words of acceptance and trust in God in

the face of loss. After seven days of suffering in silence, however, Job filled the air with complaints and accusations toward the God who had repaid his righteousness with ravaging. All people who live long enough will experience suffering and unexpected sorrows that lead them to join Job in questioning whether God is playing fair. Questions come easily; answers are hard. Studying the story of Job requires us to enter a dark world that is sometimes painfully like our own. Sometimes, like Job, the lesson we learn may be that there are no clear answers or that we may be asking the wrong questions. The book of Job recounts a dark and dangerous journey toward unseen insights that challenge both human assumptions and traditional theological beliefs. Those who dare to enter Job's world may discover that their own world--or view of the world--has changed in surprising ways. In the end, however, those who stick with the ancient sufferer may discover spiritual depths that had not previously imagined."


#### From the Spanglers


