

<u>Rotating Committees:</u> (Members serve for a three year term) - Finance- Works with staff and other committees to form a financial budget for the church each year. Monitors church giving and expenses in relations to our church budget. **Personnel-** Serves as the liaison between the pastor, congregation, staff, and Deacons. Recommends staff: salaries, job descriptions/duties, hiring, policies, and the creation of new positions. House and Grounds- Maintains the physical properties of Zion Church building and grounds by dealing with repairs, renovations, and other hands-on duties. Hospitality-Helps to provide food, cooking preparation, and event setup for various Church fellowship activities and ministries such as Zion Fest and Memorial Day. Scholarship - Provides scholastic opportunities for church members by implementing the gifts of Mills and Earcie Cornwell and Lee Cornwell. The committee members consist of those who are currently or have previously been educators. Nominating-Secures positions on Zion's standing and rotating committees, Sunday School teachers, and officers by encouraging church members to exercise their gifts and talents. Children's Advisory Committee-Works in partnership with the Youth and Children's minister to plan and promote activities and ministries that are fun and appealing to children while seeking to help them grow in Christ. The committee seeks to offer support for children and nurture them through opportunities of fellowship, worship, and education. Transportation- Helps to maintain and ensure through service, inspections, and repairs the church bus and van are in good and safe working order. Youth Ministry Council - Works in partnership with the Youth and Children's minister to plan and promote missions, activities, and ministries to build the unity of the group and help them grow in their faith.

Standing Committees: Lord's Supper- Works with church staff to schedule, prepare, and clean up quarterly communion. Sports- Organizes and runs Zion's church sports ministries. Flower- Keeps a calendar of Sunday morning worship flowers dedicated to others and makes sure there are flowers in place each Sunday. Also takes care of the Chrismon tree, poinsettias, Easter Lilies, and a Bible for newborns. Baptism- Assists baptismal candidates on the day of baptism and makes sure there are enough gowns and towels for each candidate. Missions- Coordinates church-wide mission projects, such as Community Missions Day and helps to promote various mission offerings throughout the year. Sound System, Media, and Video- Operates the Sound, Computer, and Video systems each Sunday during worship. Also helps setup and run sound and video systems used for other church ministries. Homebound- Ministers to the homebound members of our church through calls, cards, and visits. Cemetery- Meets with the deceased person's family to provide information regarding cemetery plots. Also deals with related matters regarding Zion's cemetery grounds. Fellowship Building—Coordinate Fellowship Building ministries and activities with church calendar, assist with any Fellowship Building needs. Association Messengers—Attend the Bi-Annual GCCBA meetings and keep church informed on Association ministry and mission opportunities. Money Counters— Church Hostess— FLC Rules

As of August 30th, the 2021 giving is \$61,000.00 above expenses and is \$4,564.00 below the budget. The weekly 2021 budget is \$7,455.04.

September Monthly Mission: Haiti Earthquake disaster relief

On Saturday August the 14th, a 7.2 magnitude earthquake struck the southern part of Haiti. A country that already struggles with extreme poverty and social and political unrest is in much need of our prayers and financial support. Many of the churches, schools, and orphanages have been damaged. The immediate need is to provide clean water and food assistance. Marc and Evelyne Brice, our partner missionaries in Haiti, have been tirelessly working to help those in need. Dear beloved in Christ,

Peace of God be with you. After the devastating earthquake that hit/destroyed the Great South on Saturday, all our churches, schools, buildings, and the like, are either destroyed or severely damaged. Our brothers and sisters are confused, perplexed; they don't know what to do or where to go. We are still trying to access the damages and see how we could help. For now the most urgent needs are foods and products of necessities (tents, lamps, water, bleach, etc.)
