Gospel Partnership

In the book of Acts we discover the story of the early church, a story that began with Jesus' disciples sharing the good news first to people in Jerusalem and then to other cities, towns, and areas. After the persecution of Stephen, many of Jesus followers fled Jerusalem to other towns and there continued to share the gospel. When news of these gospel seeds being planted reached the church in Jerusalem, they sent Barnabas to the town of Antioch. Barnabas joined the other believers, he encouraged them to remain true to the Lord with all their hearts, and a great number of people were brought to the Lord. He also went to Tarsus to find Saul, where he brought him back to Antioch and for a whole year they ministered to the people. It was there in the Antioch church, the disciples were first called Christians. Acts 11 also tells us a prophet came and predicted through the Spirit of a severe famine in the area. The church decided to help, so each according to their own abilities sent an offering to Jerusalem through Barnabas and Saul.

God calls each of us to minister in different ways to different communities. We plant gospel seeds in our families, at school, at work, and in our neighborhoods. God also calls us as a community of faith to gather, to share our resources, and minister in a variety of ways. Zion Baptist also partners with other churches, missionaries, and organizations to worship, to minister, and to share the Good News of Jesus. One of our partnerships is with our sister churches of Palmer Grover, Eskridge Grove, and Dover Baptist. Unfortunately, we will not gather with them for a community thanksgiving worship service this month, but hope to join together for a community mission day next spring. Another of our Gospel partnerships is with the Greater Cleveland County Baptist Association. This is a collection of Baptist churches in our community who have joined together to minister in our community. Through the ministry of our GCCBA we send monies to help folks in need. If someone is need of crisis assistance for a utility bill, or a food or clothing need, they are able to request aid from the association. We also prepare each month 75 lunch bags as part of the GCCBA feed the hungry and homeless ministry. Zion has donated toys to help with the Christmas Toy Store ministry to needy children in our community.

This past week, several in our church were able to attend the 171st Fall Bi-Annual Meeting of our Baptist Association. We heard numerous reports of all the different ministries that are going on through our association, including the search for a new director of missions. Interim Director of Missions, Rev. Leland Kerr shared a story about a local hardware store that had posted a 'Beware of Dog' sign on its front door. A man walking in to the store noticed the sign and then found himself having to step over the sleeping dog as he walked into the store. He asked the store clerk, "why was the 'Beware of Dog' sign even posted for this sleeping dog?" The store clerk replied, "before we had the sign posted, three people tripped over the dog." Leland shared that sometimes churches have a tendency to "trip over the future" out of our fear of the unknown or what the future may hold. Churches can trip. Sometimes to avoid tripping over the future, we choose to remain in the past. Leland challenged all to not fear the future, but to faithfully trust the plans God has us. He shared the passage from Jeremiah 29:11, "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." This requires us to call on God and be fully committed in our faith so we can know God's plans for us and faithfully trust God will lead us into the future. As of October 29th, giving is \$63,466.00 above expenses and is \$835.00 below the budget. The weekly 2021 budget is \$7,455.04.


