## **Lent-Our Spiritual Journey to the Cross**

On Ash Wednesday we begin the 40 day season of Lent leading us up to Easter Resurrection Sunday. For many, this is a time of inner spiritual reflection that gives us an opportunity to examine our limitations, mistakes and sins, with the hopes of gaining a better awareness of our need for a Savior. I am reminded of Richard Foster's book, "Celebration of Discipline—The Path to Spiritual Growth," where he writes about several inner spiritual disciplines, such as Meditation, Fasting, Study, and Prayer. During Lent, we often give up certain items, like coffee, chocolate, liver mush for Cleveland County folks, or even social media. This is a form of fasting, going without certain items that when craved, remind us to focus on our spiritual self and personal faith journey.

Another inward spiritual discipline that is important to practice daily is prayer. As we know, there are many different ways to pray. Foster says, "real prayer is something we learn. The disciples asked Jesus, "Lord teach us to pray" (Luke 11:1). They prayed all their lives, yet something about the quality and quantity of Jesus praying caused them to see how little they knew about prayer." Prayer is a learning process, even for those seasoned in their faith; we all still have opportunities to learn and grow in our prayer lives. We are to pray boldly, with the belief our prayers will be answered. We are to pray for God's guidance, seeking God's will in our lives and in our communities. Jesus prayed in the garden, "nevertheless not my will, but Your will be done." One of the critical parts of our prayer life is becoming in tune with God. With all the technology in our world, there is all sorts of media passing by us such as radio, tv, and internet wi-fi, yet we do not pick up these signals unless we are tuned in. Our prayers should first begin with us being tuned in to God. This may sometimes mean being silent and listening for God's voice and guidance.

Brother Lawerence, in the 17th century, became a lay brother in the Carmelite order of monks, in Paris, France. His calling was to be a servant of the servants, which he fulfilled by working in the kitchen of the monastery. He sought out to be in tune with God by developing a habitual sense of God's presence. Brother Lawerence's goal was to be constantly seeking to be in God's presence, to be wholly God's. He learned not to get angry when his mind wandered from God, but in his prayers, in his daily work, he drove away everything that was capable of interrupting his thought of God. He shared, "I have walked before God in simple faith, with humility and with love, and I apply myself diligently to do nothing and think nothing which might displease him. I hope that when I have done what I can God will do with me what He pleases". Let us follow the example of Brother Lawerence and imaging ourselves as a stone before a sculptor, which he or she will carve into a beautiful statue. We are presenting ourselves before God, asking to be formed into His perfect image in our souls.

Another form of prayer to practice is intercession prayer, or our prayers for others. One specific way to practice these prayers is praying the news headlines. With all the chaos going on now in the world, especially in Europe, a good spiritual practice is to pray for God's presence, God's will, and for God to intervene in all that is going on. We pray for all our Christian brothers and sisters and we pray God will bring peace in the midst of war. May this season of Lent be a time of personal spiritual reflection and growth. May we practice daily these disciplines of fasting, meditation, study, and prayer.

# Wednesday Bible Study—Sessions with John—The Vocabulary of Grace

Can you remember the last time you climbed a spiral staircase? Often these staircases can direct your eye to what is above, perhaps a window where you can see the light shine from the sun. When you climb a spiral staircase, with each circle you gain a different view and perspective. Robert Setzer, the author of our Bible Study says we can think of the Gospel of John as a spiral staircase. In John's story of Jesus, there are certain words, images, and themes that appear again and again. As we read the gospel, we will circle around and see the same image appear again, but from a different context. With each spiral of



truth, we will gain a deeper understanding of Jesus' words. Each week beginning March 2nd, we will look at different themes that appear in John such as, Word and Flesh, Light, Signs, Born Again, Believe, Truth, Eternal Life, Love, Paraclete/Abide, Glorified/Lamb of God, Blessed, Bread and Fish, and the Beloved Disciple. The story of Jesus shared in John's gospel is more than simply gaining a better knowledge of Jesus, but to be transformed by Jesus and becoming a new person who fully trusts and follows Him.
